


What is AWC?

Background

As Asian countries suffer from prevalent water problems, thirty-one water-related organizations (including governments, multilateral development banks, international organizations, research institutes and civil society) convened together and discussed how they will build resilient water environment in Asia by implementing practical solutions, through a series of Asia Water High-Level Roundtables 2014-2015.

Asia Water Council (AWC)

The Asia Water Council is a leading water platform that aims to provide tangible solutions to resolve water issues in Asia and beyond, and support achieving sustainable development with clean and sufficient water. AWC consists of 147 members from 27 countries, and actively cooperating with water-related organizations including governments, academic and research institutions, non-governmental organizations and civil society, as well as international organizations such as World Water Council, International Water Resources Association, Organisation for Economic Co-operation and Development, and Asian Development Bank for implementing joint projects.

Main **Activities**

Asia International Water Week (AIWW)

AIWW is a triennial water event to discuss Asia's water issues, release the joint statement, seek potential water projects, exhibit cutting-edge water technologies, and build water network.

Water Project

AWC implements demand-based water projects that provide technical and policy solutions for the identified water issues in collaboration with the AWC members, financial institutions, enterprises and academia.

International Water Cooperation

AWC has been building cooperative networks with various international water-related organizations to promote sustainable development with water by raising awareness of water issues, implementing joint projects, and hosting global water events.

Organization

Members


As of April 2021, there are 147 members from 27 countries classified into six colleges. The member organizations are composed of water policy and financing advisors, planners, government officials, technicians, engineers, scholars, and citizens of the international water community.

Board of Council

AWC's Board of Council (BoC) is the highest decision-making body composed of 27 members serving the three-year term. The BoC members are elected at the General Assembly. Each eligible member has a right to vote to decide matters related to the operation and management of the Council, its governance and accountability, finance and audit of the Secretariat, approve membership and water projects, and elect the President.

Bureau

The Bureau consists of one President who is elected among the Board Members, and four Vice Presidents and one Treasurer appointed by the recommendation of the President. The Bureau members discuss the key issues related to the operation and management of the Council and provide advice to the Board of Council.




I Special Committee

As the main drivers of the AWC, six Special Committees contribute to identify primary regional water problems and applicable solutions through feasible implementation methods. Each Special Committee evaluates the proposed water projects and nominate the final list. In addition, Special Committees organize 'Asia Water Issue' at the Asia International Water Week by coordinating AWC members to disseminate the latest water issues in each member country and share the action plans. Each Special Committee consists of Chairperson, Vice-Chairperson, Coordinator, and Members.



Secretariat

AWC Secretariat works on administrative matters of the Council, and hosts the General Assembly, Board of Council Meeting, and the AIWW. Also, it manages the membership, annual budget, documentation, and operates AWC's international cooperation activities by building networks, conducting joint research projects, and participating various global water conferences under the President's decision. The Secretariat office is located at the AWC Headquarters in Daejeon, Republic of Korea.

There are three pillars of the AIWW; Asia to World Statement, Asia Water Issue, and Water Project Business Forum.
